Goals:


- To promote academic excellence and a research-oriented culture among faculty and students through activities like book publication and national seminars.

- To develop students' ability to independently access and utilize academic resources for effective learning through structured library orientation programmes.
- To foster critical thinking, effective communication, and awareness of contemporary educational issues through panel discussions and academic dialogues.
- To provide targeted academic support for competitive examinations like TET, ensuring skill acquisition and professional eligibility of student-teachers.
- To encourage scientific thinking, subject mastery, and innovation in pedagogy by celebrating days like National Science Day that connect content with teaching methods.
- To build practical pedagogical skills and enhance capacity for classroom innovation through national workshops and hands-on training experiences.
- To cultivate reflective practice and continuous professional development by engaging studentteachers in seminars and academic interactions.
- To align institutional practices with Outcome-Based Education (OBE) principles, ensuring measurable learning outcomes and quality teacher preparation.

1. BOOK PUBLICATION

The book titled "Childhood and Growing Up: An Overview" has been edited by Dr. Rajarshi Banik, who is a faculty member of Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College, Anandanagar, Tripura. It was first published in India in 2024 by Penster Publications, Agartala, Tripura. The publication carries the ISBN number 978-81-943072-4-2, which uniquely identifies this work in academic and library records. This book represents a collective academic effort of the faculty members of BTTTC, who have contributed chapters covering a wide range of topics related to childhood development and education.

The book provides a comprehensive overview of the processes of growth and development from

infancy through adolescence, combining theoretical perspectives and practical approaches to understanding human development. It contains fourteen chapters written by different contributors, including discussions on Piaget's theory of cognitive development, Kohlberg's theory of moral development, Vygotsky's social constructivist approach, as well as the characteristics and developmental needs of infants, children, and adolescents. Issues such as individual differences, marginalization, and the influence of socio-cultural factors are also addressed. The text further explores the role of family, school, neighborhood, and community agencies in



shaping child development and highlights the significance of music and creative arts as contributors to a child's holistic growth.

The main objectives of preparing this book were to provide an overview of growth and development across different life stages, to introduce major theories of cognitive and moral development, to explain the developmental characteristics of infancy and adolescence, to discuss the importance of addressing individual differences among learners, to raise awareness about marginalization and its impacts, to analyze socio-cultural influences on children, to describe the role of family and community agencies in development, and to promote understanding of the role of music in child development.

This book is designed to serve as a valuable resource for pre-service teachers, educators, and researchers by offering both foundational knowledge and applied perspectives. It aims to equip readers with insights that will help them better understand and support the children they work with, ultimately contributing to the creation of more inclusive and developmentally responsive learning environments.

2. SIMULATED TEACHING SESSION

Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC), Anandanagar, organized Simulated Teaching Sessions for the B.Ed. Semester III students from 15th July to 30th July, 2024, as a part of their preinternship training. These sessions were an essential component of the B.Ed. curriculum and were conducted with the primary objective of equipping student-teachers with the necessary teaching skills before they proceeded to their school-based teaching internship.

Simulated teaching involves creating a controlled classroom-like environment in which student-teachers perform teaching tasks in front of their peers and under the observation of faculty members. Each student- teacher was required to prepare lesson plans in their respective pedagogy subjects such as Mathematics, Science, English, Social Science, and Bengali. They presented their lessons using appropriate teaching aids, charts, models, and blackboard work while maintaining the time frame, introducing the topic effectively, and applying suitable teaching methods.





Faculty members supervised the sessions, providing immediate feedback and constructive suggestions for improvement. Peer observations were also encouraged, allowing student-teachers to learn from each other's strengths and address common challenges. This process helped to improve their lesson organization, questioning techniques, class engagement strategies, and adaptability to different learning styles.

Through these sessions, the student-teachers gained valuable practice in translating theoretical knowledge into practical teaching actions. The activity not only enhanced their subject delivery and communication skills but also nurtured their confidence and professional readiness. Most importantly, it created a safe space for trial, error, and improvement before stepping into actual school classrooms for the internship programme.

In conclusion, the simulated teaching sessions were a successful initiative that fulfilled its purpose of preparing student-teachers for the real-time dynamics of school teaching. The participation and enthusiasm of students, along with the consistent guidance of faculty, contributed to the overall effectiveness of the programme.

3. LIBRARY ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

The Library Orientation Programme 2024 was successfully conducted at Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC), Anandanagar, under the guidance of the College Librarian. The orientation was held on 12th September 2024 for the newly admitted D.El.Ed students, and again on 23rd September 2024 for the newly admitted B.Ed students. The sessions were organized with the aim of introducing the students to the library system and services available to support their academic journey.





During the sessions, the Librarian offered a comprehensive overview of the BTTTC Library, highlighting its significance as a hub for academic learning, teaching support, and research assistance. The students were oriented on how to access and utilize the library's physical and digital resources effectively. Emphasis was placed on the proper use of the reference section, which provides access to dictionaries, encyclopedias, teacher education journals, and educational reference books.

The orientation also detailed the various services offered by the library to cater to the needs of the teaching and learning community. These include:

- Library Orientation Programme conducted annually to help new students navigate library resources.
- Reference Service to assist students and faculty in locating and using reference materials.
- Circulation Service allowing students to borrow and return books systematically.

- Book Bank Facility especially designed for SC/ST/PwD students to ensure inclusive academic support.
- Question Bank Facility providing access to previous years' question papers for exam preparation.
- Photocopying Facility enabling students to copy relevant sections of books and journals for academic use.
- Internet Facility supporting digital access to online resources and academic content.

Students were encouraged to develop the habit of reading and researching beyond the syllabus and to make full use of the facilities provided. The sessions concluded with an interactive Q&A segment, where students clarified doubts regarding library rules, membership procedures, and book borrowing limits.

The Library Orientation Programme 2024 was a meaningful and essential initiative that helped newly admitted teacher trainees become confident and independent users of library resources. It successfully laid the foundation for creating a resource-driven academic culture within the institution.

4. PANEL DISCUSSION

Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC), Anandanagar, conducted panel discussions as a part of internal evaluation on the 28th and 29th of October, 2024, with active participation from the B.Ed Semester I students. As part of the continuous internal assessment process, Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC), Anandanagar) organized Panel Discussions for B.Ed Semester I students on 28th and 29th October 2024. These discussions served as an innovative mode of internal evaluation aligned with the college's emphasis on activity-based, student-centered learning.





The panel discussions were structured to engage students in meaningful conversations on relevant

themes drawn from their core and pedagogy papers. Students were divided into small groups and assigned topics in advance, giving them time to prepare. Each panel comprised student moderators and speakers who expressed their views, responded to counter-arguments, and interacted with the audience. Faculty members observed and evaluated each session based on criteria such as clarity of expression, depth of content, logical reasoning, teamwork, and communication skills.

This format allowed students to go beyond textbook learning and reflect critically on contemporary educational issues. It also helped them develop soft skills such as public speaking, listening, and respectful disagreement—key traits of professional educators.

The initiative was well-received by students, many of whom expressed that the experience helped them overcome stage fear and build self-confidence. Faculty feedback also noted a marked improvement in student engagement and conceptual understanding.

The panel discussions not only enriched the academic environment of the institution but also reaffirmed the college's commitment to holistic and innovative evaluation practices in teacher education.

5. SPECIAL CLASSES FOR TET

Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College in collaboration with the two government registered coaching centres – *Art of Winning* and *Shomish*, organized Special TET Preparation Classes in 2024 to support aspiring teacher candidates in their exam readiness.

In an effort to strengthen the academic foundation of future teachers, Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC), Anandanagar) organized Special TET Preparation Classes in the year 2024, in collaboration with two well-known educational training organizations — Art of Winning and Shomish. These classes were specifically designed for B.Ed. and D.El.Ed. students preparing for the Teacher Eligibility Test (TET), a crucial qualifying examination for teaching positions in government schools.

The initiative aimed to supplement the regular curriculum with intensive coaching on TET-relevant topics including Child Development and Pedagogy, Mathematics, Environmental Studies, Language I & II, and general awareness. Expert trainers from *Art of Winning* and *Shomish* conducted the sessions, focusing on conceptual clarity, time management, question-solving techniques, and exam strategy. Practice tests and doubt-clearing sessions were also integral parts of the programme.

Students actively participated in the sessions and appreciated the targeted approach of the training. The classes helped many gain clarity on key concepts and develop the confidence required to face competitive exams. Faculty members of BTTTC supported the initiative by coordinating schedules and assisting in academic facilitation.

This collaborative effort successfully bridged the gap between theoretical learning and competitive examination requirements, reflecting BTTTC's commitment to empowering student-teachers with practical readiness and professional competence.

6. CELEBRATION OF NATIONAL SCIENCE DAY

Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College celebrated National Science Day on 28th February 2025 with active participation from students and faculty members.

On the occasion of National Science Day, Bhavan's Tripura Teacher TRaining College organized a day-long celebration on 28th February 2025 with great enthusiasm and participation. The event aimed at commemorating the significant contribution of Sir C.V. Raman and promoting scientific awareness among students.

One of the highlights of the celebration was the preparation and presentation of a Wall Magazine by the students, which displayed creative content related to scientific inventions, discoveries, environmental issues, and the life and work of Indian scientists. The display reflected the students' curiosity and appreciation for science in daily life.

To further engage students, a Science Quiz Competition was conducted. Students eagerly participated, and those who gave correct answers were encouraged and rewarded with pens as a token of appreciation and motivation. 7. NATIONAL WORKSHOP

The National Workshop on "Pedagogical Approaches and Innovative Teaching-Learning Strategies and Practices" was organized by the IQAC, Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC) at the BTTTC Campus from 5th to 6th March, 2025.

Objectives:

- To acquaint participants with diverse pedagogical approaches suited to 21st-century classrooms.
- To equip educators with innovative teaching-learning strategies for engaging, inclusive, and effective instruction.
- To develop participants' ability to integrate modern technologies such as AI, VR, and educational apps into classroom practices.
- To provide hands-on experience in creating and using effective teaching-learning materials (TLM).
- To foster collaboration, peer learning, and professional dialogue among educators.
- To encourage reflective practice and the adoption of student-centered teaching methods.

Introduction

A two-day National Workshop on "Pedagogical Approaches and Innovative Teaching-Learning Strategies and Practices" was organized by the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) of Bhavan's Tripura Teacher Training College (BTTTC), Anandanagar on $5^{th} - 6^{th}$ March, 2025 at the college campus. The primary objective of the workshop was to provide teachers and pre-service educators with exposure to innovative pedagogical approaches and equip them with practical strategies for effective classroom teaching.

Day 1: 5th March, 2025

The inaugural session began at 11:00 a.m. with the ceremonial lamp lighting, followed by the Bhavan's

prayer song. The session was graced by Padma Shri Prof. Arunoday Saha (Former Vice-Chancellor, Tripura University) as Chief Guest, Shri Debashis Chakraborty as President of the event, Prof. R. K. Mahto as Resource Person, and Dr. Lipika Dey (Principal, BTTTC).

In her welcome address, Dr. Dey emphasized the relevance of the workshop theme for future teachers. Prof. Mahto highlighted active learning strategies such as problem-based and collaborative learning, while Prof. Saha discussed the evolution of teaching from traditional to ICT-based approaches. Shri Chakraborty encouraged the adoption of modern tools.

Technical Session I, led by Prof. Mahto, explored *Active Learning Strategies* and *Innovative Technologies in Teaching-Learning* such as AI, VR, and digital apps. Participants also designed interactive modules.

Technical Session II engaged participants in group activities such as science demonstrations, English grammar practice, chart-making, word puzzles, and teaching aid design, encouraging creativity and hands-on learning.













Day 2: 6th March, 2025

The second day began with a lamp-lighting ceremony by Dr. Nibas Chandra Sil (Principal In-Charge, College of Teacher Education, Kumarghat). Dr. Sil, in Technical Session I, delivered a talk on Student-Centered Learning Environments based on constructivist pedagogy.

In **Technical Session II**, Dr. Sil guided participants on lesson planning, classroom techniques, digital tools, and assessment strategies, followed by a practical-oriented lecture by Sri Alak Dey (Associate Professor, BTTTC) on selecting pedagogical approaches and using teaching aids effectively.

It provided teachers with valuable insights into modern pedagogical methods, encouraged innovation, and strengthened collaborative learning networks. (B) Relief Distribution Program (31st August 2024)


9. HIV/AIDS AWARENESS PROGRAMME
